Dear Friends of the Epilepsy Foundation of Florida,

Over the past twelve years, I've had the pleasure of watching the Epilepsy Foundation of Florida (EFOF) lead the fight against epilepsy in the state of Florida. While the challenges associated with epilepsy are many, I'm continuously inspired by the strength in community built by our volunteers, board of directors, donors, members, and staff. Their steadfast commitment to our mission of stopping seizures, finding a cure, and saving lives is the very reason our flame burns so bright.

As I reflect on this past year, it was a very special one for us. EFOF celebrated a milestone moment: its 45-year anniversary. What began with one support group in a Miami living room in 1971 has grown to a statewide organization that works to serve the more than 400,000 Floridians affected by the disorder. As part of this celebration, it was humbling to reconnect and honor the founders of EFOF, Marjorie and Mark Buchbinder.

This past year also brought with it several notable successes. Our annual Walk the Talk for Epilepsy events experienced record attendance and surpassed fundraising goals. Statewide, more than 3,500 participants were involved and over \$400,000 was raised. As the premier source of information and resources for epilepsy education in Florida, we've experienced increased interest from businesses and the community at large to advertise with EFOF. In response, we launched a menu of advertising solutions through our website, newsletter, social media platforms, and webinars. We look forward to continuing to grow this new source of revenue in support of our organization. EFOF hosted its first Florida Pediatric Epilepsy Network Conference which brought together 127 neurologists from across the state to discuss the latest medications, advancements, and treatments in the field. As we continue to stay on the cusp of innovative therapy, the year also saw our clients enjoying new and exciting alternative therapies including yoga and art.

In this annual report, I'm pleased to acknowledge our successes, like those above, and share our progress made in the 2016-2017 year.

As we look forward, EFOF remains dedicated to meeting the needs of Floridians who are living with epilepsy at the local, county, state, and national levels. Together, we'll continue to bring hope and transformation to their lives and invest in the shared vision of a world without epilepsy.
